c. To provide the Monroe County Legislature with two voting positions on their board of directors. One such position shall be filled by a nominee of the majority leader of the Legislature and the other shall be filled by a nominee of the minority leader of the Legislature.

d. To abide by and be subject to New York State competitive bidding statutes as adopted and periodically amended by the State Legislature.

e. To have the Monroe County Legislature approve their annual budgets prior to the start of their fiscal years, beginning in 2015.

f. To require the consent of the Monroe County Legislature, by a majority vote, of any amendments to any contract between the local development corporation and Monroe County.

g. To file all contracts, and any subcontracts thereto, with the Clerk of the County Legislature within five (5) calendar days of the execution of the contract. When filing these records, the local development corporation shall provide a summary detailing the names and titles of all principal officers of the entities entering into the contract or subcontract.

h. To require that quarterly financial reports and annual audited financial statements of be submitted to and filed with the Clerk of the Legislature. The annual audit reports shall be filed within 181 days of the end of the local development corporation's fiscal year.
